




By Summer 2020, Lenae will have visited 10 district churches, all of whom have generously extended their support through prayer, counsel, and resources! Lenae is grateful for the guidance and encouragement of so many of her peers. Since October, HR's Core Team has grown to 10 adults, and two families from the neighborhood have joined Hope Rising at the table for bimonthly Dinner Church worship gatherings. In January and February, we hosted a Family Winter Jam as well as a Kids Night! In March, we will begin hosting indoor playgroups on weekday mornings to help parents of little ones in our community connect with one another and introduce them to Hope Rising. We are also establishing relationships with our local elementary schools.

Hope Rising's public launch is set for Easter 2020. In our initial months, we pray to grow, welcome our first members, and baptize new believers into the Body of Christ! We thank God for His provision and vision for this work!







• a Church of the Nazarene



Hope is the word that would describe the Bedford Church of the Nazarene in 2019. Our goal for this past year was to share the hope of Christ with those around us.




2019 has been a pivotal year for myself as a pastor, and for Bel Air Church of the Nazarene. In April, the door was opened for me to assume the role of lead pastor in Bel Air. One major endeavor in this first year is putting together a pastoral staff. It is now a collection of some who were already serving on staff, some from within the church community who were hired, as well as one staff pastor from the Midwest. I am so thankful for the team I have the privilege to partner with in ministry at BACON!

A focus for this year has been to THINK YOUNGER. This translated into two specific initiatives:
•We created a task force to work alongside our NMI Council, composed of younger folks from our church, to work on our Faith Promise Initiative. We also included some who didn't really know what Faith Promise is. Over the span of a month, we communicated what giving and Faith Promise are about, culminating with a Faith Promise Sunday, where special speakers Tom & Amy Hanes communicated vision for us to be a blessing to others around the world. In the community meal after service, we celebrated eclipsing our goal for Faith Promise by more than \$15,000!

•Another initiative we started later in the year was TEXT TALK. It's when our Mosaics (college/career age) and Young Adults Singles and Married are invited to someone's home for a meal, as well as a discussion of Scripture texts that will be used for sermons on future Sunday mornings. This has been received well! We've had to make room for as many as 22 who attend these regular times of eating together and sharing together from the Word of God. It is discipleship for the group, and it gives this group a sense of connection to our church services, as well as providing the pastor with additional perspective on the application of the text that can be incorporated into the message.



By God's help, 25 have been baptized this year through the ministry of our church.





The River continues to look for ways to connect with the people in our community that are not connected with any church.

There are two related doors God has opened for us in the past year. The first one is Beyond the Bell an after school program in connection with Berlin Intermediate School. Each Wednesday a school bus drops around 8 students off at The River. The students get tutoring as they complete their homework, get a snack, and learn a life lesson. At the end of the session we have a dinner the children help coordinate and set up where we invite their families to join them for a family dinner. We also invite the church to come and interact with these families. At the last dinner we also invited their teachers to join us. Through this program we hope to build relationships with unchurched at risk children and to bring them and their families into a relationship with Jesus.


Beyond the Bell brings children to the church. Our other door God has opened for us is our Popup Ministry. With Pop up we go to a local park and set up music and a grill and give away hot dogs and hamburgers. This year we made a connection with a staff member of Worcester Youth and Families and were able to coordinate a pop up with a basketball camp at a local park. Later we joined her and a group of at risk students she is working with for a field day at the park. Then we brought those children to The River for a cookout and wild wet fun day.

We have not had anyone attend a Sunday service through these events, but we are scattering seed in our community. Our goal for the coming year is to pray for and participate in the harvest.



Our goal for this coming year is to place more emphases in reaching out to families with children and teens; our numeric goal is 25.







For those who have the ears to hear, let them hear.







This past year has been one of many changes. The first change was that we switched sanctuaries with Fountain of Grace Church of the Nazarene. They had outgrown the smaller sanctuary and our congregation was not growing, so we decided switching was a sacrifice we should make. Little did we know that making this loving sacrifice would not only be a blessing for our sister congregation, but God would use this as a blessing in disguise for us as well. This move was the fresh perspective our congregation needed to begin envisioning ourselves not as a small struggling church, but as a congregation open to change and new possibilities. Within a few months of worshiping in our new space, God began sending us more visitors than we have had in years. We have always had a lot of visitors at certain times of the year, but the visitors have not stopped coming and more than a few have returned. Among those who have returned to make our congregation their new home have been two immigrant families, who just moved to the U.S. Each of these families have six children for a total of twelve new children, aging from one to nineteen years old. Within weeks we managed to mobilize our congregation to provide four new teachers, two new children's Sunday school classes and with the help of other Nazarene congregations throughout the district, we have also provided these two families with needed household supplies.

I believe the most amazing aspect of moving to the chapel and the steady numeric growth, which God has blessed us with this past year, has been the reawakening that has taken place within our existent church family. New people are stepping into leadership roles and many more are serving with a renewed sense of joy and anticipation of what God will do next. It has been a blessing to see the deepening of our congregation's faith and continuing growth in holiness this past year even though by God's help, we have not baptized any new people through the ministry of our church. However, I have witnessed our people growing in grace and holiness, while God continues to bless them in their faithfulness.


God is good! All the time! These truths are shared often in our church!


Looking ahead, our continual goal is to be a welcoming, authentic community of faith; a place where all of us look more like Jesus today than we did yesterday.

By God's help, three people have come to Christ this year through the ministry of our church.





In 2019, we implemented a sweeping vision that invites people into a growing relationship with Jesus. We believe, and emphasize, that growing in Jesus through the ministry of Crossroads will help you discover Jesus, make it simple to belong to our church, help you identify your role to play in God's story, and develop a faith that works and serves in today's world. We will work our people through these four objectives, and we believe if they participate in these missions of our church, they will find a flourishing faith even in the complexities of living in 2020.

The earliest place that we are seeing movement in making it simple to belong to our church family. We are finding that a lack of belonging is a profound need in our society today. Loneliness is crippling, and there is evidence that people are feeling it in a profound manner. We are working to open to the doors to the lonely so that they feel like they have a community to which they belong. One family who moved here because of military assignment told me that "this is the friendliest church they have ever encountered." They were especially amazed that other teens—not just youth pastor and leaders—invited their teens to be a part of youth group.

We have seen 'belonging' hit fever pitches in a few areas in 2019 – multiple members of our Celebrate Recover ministry testified to God's freedom on a Sunday morning and were warmly welcomed and celebrated by the church. We debuted a food truck night where we had a community members in the summer with two food trucks on our property. 700-800 people showed up, mostly folks of our neighborhood. We saw our "Created Special" ministry offer support and hospitality to families touched by disability. We also donated to over 50 families in need at Christmastime. Identifying those prone to loneliness and demonstrating pathways to belonging through kindness and hospitality has been a door that keeps opening for us at Crossroads.

By God's help, 17 people have been baptized this year through the ministry of Crossroads.



It was said at the local convenience store to a gentleman from our congregation. Most people probably would not have thought twice about it. But when I finally got to hear what was said, I couldn't have been more proud. "Oh, you go to that church that helps people." We've strived to be the hands & feet of Christ to people all around us this past year. We've helped a widowed grandma who has full custody of her 9-year old grandson due to her son's ravaging drug addiction. We've helped a struggling family of 5 in our local community through providing them with Thanksgiving & Christmas Dinners and gifts for their children. We are working on helping a lady in our congregation with some dental issues due to a genetic disorder that she has. We are helping an elderly homebound couple—both in their 90's—with weekly meals brought to them by various folks in our church. Through the Fawn Grove Compassion Center, we are regularly helping folks & families out in the surrounding community with clothing and other items to meet their needs. We have really stepped up to help a family of 4, and soon to be 5, in our church. The husband & father was wrongly convicted and sentenced to jail time, leaving his wife to care for their two young boys and a baby on the way. On the Sunday they announced this news to the congregation, I found myself all alone after service in the usually-packed church foyer, for a long line of people had formed in the sanctuary to take turns asking this family how they could be of help. People have brought them meals, groceries, loads of free firewood, Christmas gifts for the boys, provided regular weekly childcare, given money—significant amounts of money, and frequently checked in to provide emotional support during this very difficult time for this family. "Oh, you go to that church that helps people." Yes, yes, I do!

A goal we have is to see 10 people come to faith in Christ through the ministry of our church this year. And by God's help, 7 people were baptized last year!





By God's help we had 11 people that come to Christ, 6 were baptized in the water baptism and 6 new affiliate to the Church.






This year we have been faithful in continuing to share the love and Salvation of our God. Through our Mothers of Pre-school Children (MOPS) our doors have been open as we have surrounded and helped these families experience the grace of God. We have provided a washer and dryer for a family in need. In addition, we provided a safe place for a family as the parents worked through marital problems. Our members' doors were open to the mother and children until the relationship was reconciled and restored.

It seems every year we assist a member of the Church of the Nazarene who is vacationing in Gettysburg. This year we provided assistance to a Nazarene Youth Group from Virginia when their bus broke down in Gettysburg.

We continue to see those entering the retirement age coming back to church. This year we have people who have come to Gettysburg because they need the support of their family. They are not able to attend church regularly, but still desire the fellowship that they had in their previous Church of the Nazarene. This has opened the door for us to begin ministries in a nursing home and visiting others with those who are not able to attend Sunday services.

Our youth have shown light on another door that is opened for us. After coming back from teen camp in which they learned about human trafficking, they expressed a concern about those who are living in nearby migrant camps. This year our goal is to join in with the Fruit Farmers Christian Ministries. Our goal is to meet the physical and spiritual needs to one of the 120 migrant camps in the Adams, Cumberland, and Franklin Counties in Pennsylvania. Currently only 19 camps are being cared for.







One of the amazing things that God has done through the ministry of our church this past year is our launching of a new ministry called "Embrace Grace". One of our ladies who is a registered nurse began working part time for our local Crisis Pregnancy Clinic. There she learned about a national ministry called "Embrace Grace" which gives local churches the resources to mentor and support pregnant single women who have chosen to give birth to their babies rather than abort them. Our lady began to feel that God was leading her to start an Embrace Grace group in our church. When our church leaders and I heard about the program we decided to step out and start this new program. The program includes a weekly Bible study with the women and teaches parenting skills. At the end of the study the church provides a dinner banquet and pampering day for the women and a baby shower with their families where the ladies are given everything they will need to care for their babies, including a car seat. We started our first Embrace Grace group in May with five women from outside our church. Two of the women opened their hearts to Jesus through this ministry. In September we started an ongoing mentoring/Bible study program which is step #2 for the women with some new moms joining in. In this "Embrace Life" group the moms are discipled and further trained in parenting skills. We conducted the Embrace Life group on Wednesday nights which allows the children to attend our Caravan program. The children this group has brought out has infused new energy into our Caravan program. We have now begun our second Embrace Grace group and we have several more women from outside our church attending regularly. In addition to Embrace Grace, we are excited that many of our single young adult college and career age people are stepping into positions of church ministry and key leadership roles. Our goal for the coming year is to increase the evangelistic passion of our church and to see more of our people seeking to lead their friends and family members to Jesus. By God's help, six people have come to Christ this year through the ministry of our church.



By God's help twelve people came to Christ in 2019 through the ministry of our church. Four people were baptized; we had five child dedications and five new members were received.







Our prayer is that we will be directed to the lost in our community and prepare ourselves to faithfully minister to their needs.



This is a good sign for a small church. 

GOAL: Building strong and loving Christians through the teaching of God's Word.






We have also engaged in voluntary work in the community. We received and distribute food from the food bank throughout the year.

Early in 2019 Pastor Eli from Hagerstown Latino Church contacted me to talk about beginning a Latino ministry in Martinsburg. We were excited to see what God would do through cooperation. We have received a wonderful blessing and gift in the Latino ministry that is slowly morphing into its own Latino congregation in Martinsburg, with Pastor Pablo Nieles leading. Martinsburg 1st cannot claim credit for the success of the Latino ministry beyond providing space in which to operate. Also, they have been a blessing to our congregation. Since beginning their ministry in our facility, they have remodeled two important spaces. First, they have impacted our church's ability to accommodate young families with an improved nursery. Second, they increased the functionality of our main discipleship space. Most importantly, the Latino congregation is an example to ours by showing us how to reach our community with compassion and love. Their prayer activities, the involvement of their youth of their leadership and activities have encouraged our congregation to follow suit. This past fall, our church board voted to give a local minister's license to one of our youth, who, after his attendance at NYC in Phoenix last summer expressed a call to ministry as well as received a scholarship to attend ENC upon his high school graduation. In the past year God has laid upon my heart the need to give greater attention to the sacraments and we have increased celebration of the Lord's Supper from quarterly to now monthly. In February we will increase to every other week, and then on Pentecost of this year we will commence weekly celebrations of the Lord's Supper. By God's help, one person has been baptized this year through the ministry of our church. Our youngest child, our daughter, Abigail was baptized by Dr. Bowser at Family Camp since the last district assembly. Therefore, since I have discovered that there are at least a handful of professing believers in our congregation who have not been baptized we will baptize them this year. By the grace of God, we hope to convert, baptize and disciple five new believers this year in addition to those who are already believers and have yet to be baptized.







Rebecca has a long road ahead and already there have been many hours of prayer for her and her 2 boys and her husband as they are all struggling to find peace, but we can see where God is moving and we celebrate His goodness in all things. God's goodness is all over the work He is doing in the body of Melwood and we know there is more to come as He is showing us what is next.



After seven years of learning experiences, trying to develop community ministry in Middletown, DE, we found ourselves buying, moving into, and beginning to renovate a 135 year old Victorian home a block from downtown, which supplied the space we'd been lacking before.

This fall saw campfires, game nights, homework help, and weekly community dinners where all were invited and welcomed in the spirit of Christian hospitality. God has blessed us with committed friends and neighbors who've become board members as our Church-type mission is starting to look more like a church.

One unexpected blessing has been to provide a safe place for a number of teenagers to escape the stress of their lives for a little while and find loving support. We continue to be encouraged by friends and co-workers, as well as strangers who've heard about our commitment to hospitality and community in Middletown. The word is spreading.

The goal for this year is to work toward intentional community, an established core group beyond just a series of events. We also hope to finish renovations on the third floor, which we will use as transitional living space for people in need. We've already been contacted by several social workers and counselors who are excited to have this space available in the near future.

It will require work and additional funding – so I'd be happy to talk with you more about sharing our vision with your congregation and looking for ways to partner together!



In the last year we at MCN have cultivated our existing missional partnerships to bless the community. We hosted a one-day multi-cultural, multi-congregational Vacation Bible School (4 cultures and 4 churches). We have seen several new families begin attending or return to attendance. We recognize one new decision for Jesus Christ. Two discipleship groups have met faithfully to connect people to the transforming power of the word of God. We have served the community by providing food, serving together at the soup kitchen and providing clothing. We have been a safe place for women and children to sleep in cold weather. God has been worshipped, the sacraments of both kind have been served, and the word has been proclaimed. During the last year, MCN has forged a missional partnership with Love INC. and Code Purple Sussex County. During the past 12 months, we have become the Milford Cold Weather Shelter for women and children. In the fall, we found out that Code Purple lost its site for intake and feeding the Cold Weather Shelter guests. Sensing an opportunity to strengthen our relationship and more effectively minister to this at-risk population in our community.

For the past two months, each evening has seen up to twenty people, guests as well as volunteers gather in our fellowship hall to share a meal, to fellowship, to experience hospitality and to have a safe place to sleep. At least six members of our local congregation are volunteering to stay overnight, to provide meals, to transport guests, or to provide welcome and intake. Real relationships are being built. Spiritual conversations are being had. Guests from Code Purple have come to worship services. I believe with all my heart that seeds of the Kingdom are being planted and people are engaging in Kingdom business.



By God's help, 3 people have been baptized this year through the ministry of our church.







By God's help many have come to a saving knowledge of Jesus this year through the multiple outreaches of the Mount Tabor Church of the Nazarene.



This year, a door for ministry opened for New Beginning Church in walking with various individuals going through deep moments of grief and mourning. Our congregation experienced more loss and hurt over the course of this past year than in the previous 5 years combined. Children of parishioners were lost to drug overdoses; families dealt with loss of parents, spouses, children, and grandchildren; and memories were lost as a family lost everything in a house fire. As a congregation that had previously been relatively untouched by this kind of deep loss and grief, 2019 served as a year of caring for others, loving well, and walking alongside those going through seasons of grief and sorrow.


Over the course of the year, the New Beginning congregation supported a family walking through a fatal drug overdose by giving thousands of dollars in support in addition to hours upon hours of time. Our congregation has loved another family who lost 3 family members in 3 months over the summer in addition to losing their home in a fire in December. Money, hours of service, and caring conversations abounded in serving this family well. We have started new GriefShare ministries over the past year and have been able to walk with many in our community though various difficult circumstances. In addition, New Beginning partnered with another local congregation to serve a family in our community whose mobile home caught fire in the fall. With God's help, a new mobile home was secured and renovated in less than 2 months' time allowing this family to celebrate Christmas in their new home. Jesus' words in John 13:35 say, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." I am thankful for a congregation that has walked through the door of loving well this year.

The mission of Table Life Church is to learn the way of Jesus together as we invite others to join us at His Table. Inspired by our mission statement we will be attending to two "big rocks" this year: "life together" and "inviting others." That is to say we have two goals for 2020. 1) We intend to nurture deeper community by maximizing our Third Sunday Common meals and our Table Groups while giving space for more affinity groups to form. 2) We intend to start a community conversation about the simple practice of "inviting others" to our Table Life gatherings and ministries. We will be highlighting invitation as a simple, non-threatening way of encouraging friends and families to give the way of Jesus consideration by being a part of a community that values belonging even before one believes or behaves. Opportunities to serve our parish are numerous and more than I could cover in this report. The Spirit of Christ has set many tables so as to include and serve others. Through our New Hope partnership we provide food support to families on the margins by "running the store" on the second Sunday of the month. On the last Wednesday of the month we provide a free meal so that our church and neighborhood can connect. We call it "The Neighborhood Table." We continue to share table fellowship with our sisters and brothers from Tabarre Church of the Nazarene in Port au Prince. This Summer we hosted a team from their church and enjoyed serving, eating and worshipping together. Jesus has set another table among us in the area of recovery ministries. Pastor Jeff Wolfe serves as our Pastor of Christian Formation, Jeff has opened a private counseling practice at Table Life. On Sunday nights Jeff leads an "At the Cross Recovery" group composed of both Table Life people and others from our parish. This year we plan to offer "Reboot." Reboot is a recovery ministry for combat veterans and first responders. Jesus is gathering a beautiful community around His Table in New Cumberland. By God's help thirteen people have been baptized this year through the ministry of our church.





This year, we want to empower young people to do Amazing things by dreaming "God Dreams". By God's help, 3 people have come to Christ this year through the ministry of our church.







By God's help, we would like to see the church double in growth this coming year.






Grace and peace from God, our Father, the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Mighty Counselor,

In this coming year, we hope to go deeper into the Word to read it, live it and give it.





Over the last year, many amazing things have happened at our church. January, February and March are always busy months for us with our Upward Sports Basketball & Cheerleading Ministry. 

Our goal for 2020 is to be more effective in organic outreach so that new Christians are formed in faith and join the church.



While we have made some progress with our strategic goals for 2019, we remain committed to improving the music component of our worship service and our children's ministry in 2020.





By God's help, 1 person was called to ministry and was baptized this year through the ministry of our church.









R.M- A retired jail officer recently joined our church and he and his wife do jail ministry



There were no baptisms in 2019, but with God's help that will not be the case in 2020.



By the grace of God we baptized 2 this year.






We had two water baptism and five baby dedications and one person accepted Jesus Christ.
